The disorder may be caused by several different medical problems, but is most frequently caused by a deficiency of the thrombopoietin (TPO) protein. Until recently, it was believed that this deficiency was only present in a small percentage of chronic thrombocytopenia cases, and thus, was not useful as a diagnostic marker of the condition. New research has since shown that a deficiency of TPO is present in a much larger percentage of cases, making TPO an extremely valuable marker for the diagnosis of this condition. What is Thrombocytopenia? Thrombocytopenia is a reduction of platelets, which are a vital component of the blood and act as one of the key regulators in clotting. Thrombocytopenia can be caused by several different medical problems. For example, it can be caused by: Mutations and deletions in the genes that make up the TPO receptor. A decrease in production of TPO, either due to a deficiency in the production of the protein itself or due to decreased production of the TPO receptor. Overproduction of the TPO receptor. Hemolytic anemia, which leads to the destruction of the red blood cells. The destruction of red blood cells, in turn, can lead to an increase in TPO, as TPO is also an important regulator of red blood cell production. A deficiency of the Vitamin K-dependent coagulation factors (factors II, VII, IX, X, and protein C), which also leads to a reduction in platelets. In the context of this article, chronic thrombocytopenia refers to a reduction of platelets below a certain limit. This limit is typically 100,000 to 200,000 per microliter of blood, but there is some variation depending on the clinical setting. Chronic thrombocytopenia can be classified according to the level of platelet count in the blood. There are four categories: Normal. Platelets count is normal. Mild. Platelets count is slightly decreased. Moderate. Platelets count is moderately decreased. Severe. Platelets count is severely decreased. What are the Symptoms of Chronic Thrombocytopenia?
